Mark Brigham (45 min) – Presentation “Bats: What is true, what is myth and mostly what we don't know” main tent

Earth Ball Games (20 min) – various games using the University of Regina’s Earth Ball led by Steve Biss,– soccer field at tent village

Owl Pellets (20 min) – Owl pellet dissection led by Cori Sass with live Great Horned Owl (Ozzie) and Jim Elliott – main tent

Sketch/Poetry (20 min) – Students have the option of field sketching and/or poetry writing - in marsh area (between winterhouse and pour-a-pond site.)

Bird Watching (30 min) – Start at Faraway Place (protected); learn to use binoculars and find bird signs on Goose Island; learn about field marks. Look at live birds in the marsh.

Hike / BBSH (30 min) – Hike up Wascana Hill and back down through the Habitat Conservation Area on route to the dipping docks, while doing a Bird Behaviour Scavenger Hunt (BBSH.) Lead facilitators are Bob Ewart (Wascana Centre Authority), Dale Douglas (Nature Regina) and Dale Hjertaas (Nature Regina).

Pond Dipping (30 min) – Dipping on docks with Ducks Unlimited Canada staff; wing string to measure a student’s “wing span.”

Pour-a-Pond (30 min)– Near dipping docks with Linda Dodd, Janet Galger and Kim Epp.

EarthSongs (20 min) – Dr. Don Waite (EarthSong Productions) and Christine Bilinski will share some EarthSongs with student participation – in main tent area.
